Rooted in that same spirit of innovation, Tiger Trails and Den Academy is where the next generation of dreamers, scientists, and conservationists will take their first steps. Inspired by the timeless charm of the iconic Fisher-Price barn, this reimagined experience blends nostalgia with fresh excitement — a place where families laugh, learn, and play together in a world alive with oinks, bleats, baas, hee-haws, and clucks.

Children can explore lively farm scenes, meet friendly goats, alpacas, pigs, chickens, and donkeys, and engage all their senses in a setting designed for discovery. At its heart stands an antique tractor, a proud **tribute to the roots of all Kansans** — a reminder that ours is an agricultural state that feeds the world and that hard work, care, and connection to the land are part of our shared story.



Alongside the barn is the farm-inspired play area that offers **endless opportunities for joy** — climbing, sliding, jumping, and imagining — while comfortable guest amenities provide shaded seating, gathering spaces, and conveniences that invite families to stay, relax, and enjoy hours of fun together.




# DISCOVERY FOREST



Discovery Forest is where every branch tells a story, and every visit deepens our connection to life.

The Lianas Forest at the Topeka Zoo is being reimagined as “Discovery Forest”, a renewed celebration of the incredible diversity of life found in forests around the world — from the tropical rainforests of Borneo to the misty mountain forests of the Himalayas. This renovation honors what guests already love while introducing exciting new experiences, vibrant habitats, and opportunities to connect with nature in powerful new ways.

At the heart of Discovery Forest lives the beloved orangutan family that generations of guests have come to know and love — each with a unique personality, history, and charm. Their enhanced indoor and outdoor habitats encourage natural behaviors through sway poles, climbing structures, enrichment zones, and training areas designed to promote movement, learning, and wellbeing.

An outdoor parallel play zone beside the orangutan habitat invites children to climb, swing, and explore just like the orangutans they’re observing — creating shared moments of wonder and empathy through play.



The forest story grows even richer with the arrival of two new species joining the Topeka Zoo for the very first time:

- **Clouded leopards**, the mysterious and agile “ghosts of the forest,” whose extraordinary climbing abilities and striking markings reveal the hidden beauty and stealth of rainforest canopies.
- **Red pandas**, charismatic climbers from the cool, misty forests of the Himalayas, bringing warmth, charm, and an opportunity to explore the diversity of forest ecosystems across the globe.

Guests can enjoy **year-round connections** through thoughtfully designed indoor and outdoor viewing areas, keeping them close to the action no matter the season. At the center of the indoor experience, the **Green Gallery** immerses visitors in a world of botanical wonders, featuring rare orchids, towering tropical plants, and fascinating carnivorous species — a paradise for plant lovers and a reminder of the complexity and resilience of forests everywhere.

Discovery Forest is a place of **renewal and reconnection** — where we celebrate the diversity of life, nurture curiosity, and honor the incredible stories of animals and plants from forests near and far.

At the heart of this experience lies a **technology hub**, a dynamic learning space that mirrors the pulse of real-world conservation. Designed like an **anti-**





The renovated Rainforest Dome will showcase a rich tapestry of life — from **Komodo dragons** in expansive indoor-outdoor habitats that highlight their power and majesty, to **dazzling dart frogs** illuminating the forest floor with brilliant color. **Sloths, golden lion tamarins, and tropical birds** bring motion, charm, and curiosity to every corner, emphasizing the intricate connections within rainforest ecosystems.



Thoughtfully redesigned indoor and outdoor spaces will **increase accessibility and visibility**, allowing guests of all ages to get closer to the animals while maintaining safe and respectful viewing. Elevated platforms, open sightlines, and immersive habitat design create a 360-degree rainforest experience, making every visit engaging, educational, and unforgettable.

The Rainforest Dome is a place of **reimagination and reconnection** — where guests can witness tropical biodiversity up close, understand the urgent conservation challenges these species face, and be inspired to protect the ecosystems they call home. Under Clarke's leadership, the organization developed a comprehensive vision to address all aspects of zoo operations, including safety, accreditation, customer service, finance, facilities, and governance.

## GOVERNANCE

On April 3, 2021, the City of Topeka and Friends of the Topeka Zoo joined in a Public Private Partnership, transitioning full responsibility for the operations and funding model for the Topeka Zoo & Conservation Center to Friends of the Topeka Zoo. This allowed the zoo to move forward as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit. The Topeka Zoo & Conservation Center is now a true performance and mission-based organization, free from limitations associated with a municipal form of governance.

## GAGE PARK IMPROVEMENT

During the November 2022 ballot, residents of Shawnee County voted to implement a 0.2% sales tax to support the three entities located within Gage Park, including the Topeka Zoo & Conservation Center. This tax generates annual revenue to sustain the operational budget of the zoo.
